- Mastery of content assessed through writing, application of concepts and generalization of material through a variety of formats

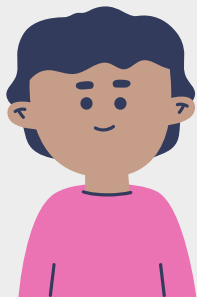
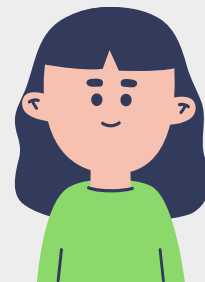
At Lake Braddock every student can be a good math student - The key is to find the right math class for your student.

Algebra 1 HN - High School credit Algebra with extensions



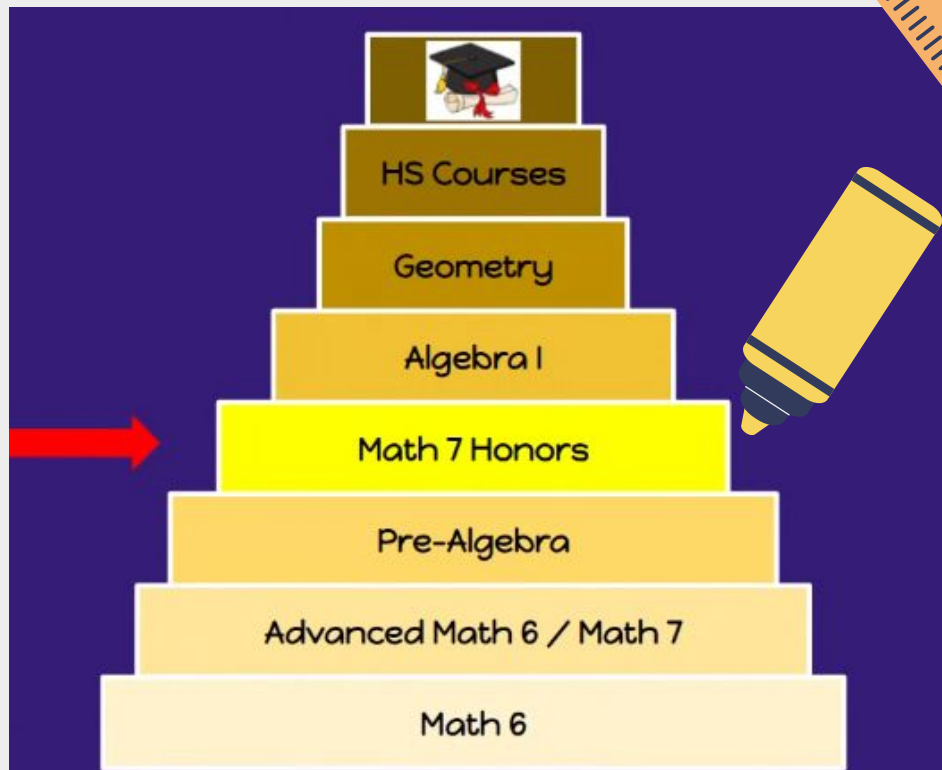
Let's Talk Math 7 Honors

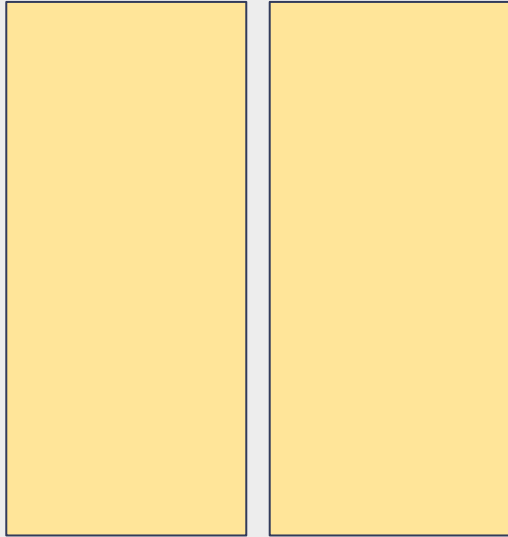

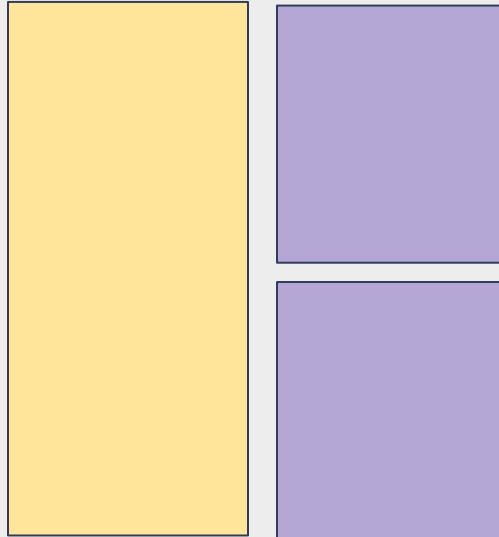

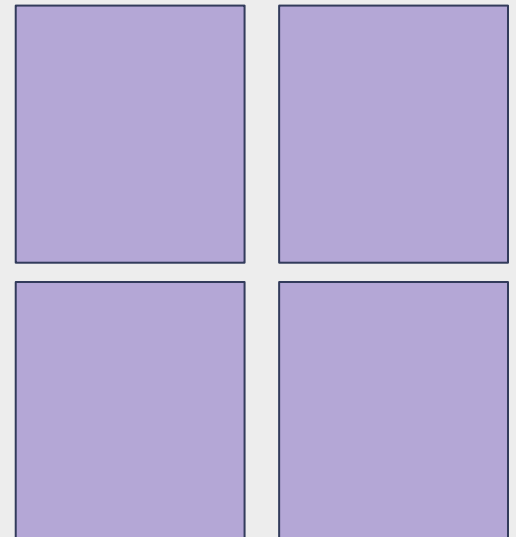
How many elective classes do students get to take?
