FOR IN-PERSON EXAMS AT SCHOOL:

There are instructions and registration tasks to be completed before the actual exam begins at the published time. Once the exam has begun, **NO** student will be allowed into the testing room. **NO** exceptions.

WHO TAKES THE EXAM:

All students enrolled in an AP course have the option to take the AP exam. Students who decide not to take the exam should opt-out of the exam. However, if you do not opt-out of the exam and end up not taking the exam, you will not be charged an unused test fee.

YOU SHOULD BRING THE FOLLOWING ITEMS IN A CLEAR ZIP LOCK BAG TO IN-PERSON EXAMS:

- Several sharpened No. 2 pencils (with erasers) for all multiple-choice answer sheets. **Mechanical pencils will NOT scan - do not bring them.**
- Pens with black or dark blue ink for completing areas on the exam booklet covers and for free-response questions in most exams.

- A watch that does not beep or have an alarm in case the exam room does not have a clock that can be easily seen.
- Approved calculators with the necessary capabilities if you are taking the Calculus AB, Calculus BC, Chemistry, Physics 1, Physics 2, Physics C: Mechanics, Physics C: Electricity & Magnetism, or Statistics exams. You should bring a calculator approved for use on designated parts of the exam. Visit www.collegeboard.org/ap/calculators to learn more about the calculator policy for each of these exams and for a list of authorized calculators. We will not have calculators or batteries available to borrow. Bring extra batteries.
- A ruler or straightedge only if you are taking an AP Physics Exam. None will be provided at your exam. Protractors are not allowed.
- If you choose, an **unlabeled** clear water bottle or **blank** metal water bottle identified with your name. The bottle will not be allowed in the testing room but will be kept in a secure location nearby. You will be able to access your water during the designated break.

YOU SHOULD NOT BRING THE FOLLOWING TO IN-PERSON EXAMS:

- NO electronic equipment (Cell phone, smartphone, smartwatch or wearable technology of any kind, laptop, tablet computer, Bluetooth devices, iPods, pagers, MP3 players, cameras or other photographic equipment, devices that can access the internet, and any other electronic or communication devices). **Students using any of these devices during an exam or exam break will be dismissed in accordance with College Board guidelines, and your score may be canceled.**
- NO pencil cases, backpacks, purses, books, compasses, correction fluid, dictionaries, highlighters, colored pencils or notes. Keys are fine.
- NO rulers and straightedges (except as noted above for any AP Physics students).
- NO scratch paper - We will provide it for you, as needed; Also, notes can be made on portions of the exam booklets.
- NO computers (except as noted for students with College Board approved accommodations) or calculators (except as noted above for certain exams).
- NO watches that beep or have an alarm.
- NO clothing with subject-related information. You can bring an appropriate jacket/sweater, as it can get cold in rooms. NO ear plugs.
- NO food. IF you have two exams in one day, you may bring a bag lunch (to be kept in a secure location) to eat in-between exams.

TIME:

Most AP exam administrations will take 3 ½ to 4 hours. For *in-person* exams: You **may not** be dismissed until an exam has officially ended. Do not ask to leave early if you finish before the end of the test, as your request will be denied. If you play a sport or have a job, it will be your responsibility to inform your coach or employer of your AP obligation, and arrangements should be made accordingly. Afternoon exams will end at approximately **4:00pm** therefore, you will need to arrange for transportation.

ATTENDANCE:

On a day you have an AP exam (digital or in-person), you will be excused from your classes for the entire day. You will be coded as "TST" for all periods on the day of your respective exam(s). Unlike in past years, students do not need to complete a form to notify the school to excuse absences on exam days. Students testing in-person on May 21, if you choose to attend class before or after your AP exam, please check-in with your subschool so your attendance is corrected in SIS.

LATE OR SICK:

The College Board has strict guidelines on who may take a late exam. College Board may allow a late test for a serious illness and a doctor's note will be required for such a request. Late testing is not allowed for oversleeping, minor illnesses, or car trouble, so plan accordingly and leave home with time to spare. As a reminder, you will not be charged an unused test fee if you do not test on your scheduled exam day.

BEHAVIOR:

You are required to abide by the policies of both the College Board and Lake Braddock Secondary School during the exam period. Any misconduct will be reported and could jeopardize your AP Exam grade.
