- There are instructions and registration tasks to be completed BEFORE the actual exam begins at the published time. Once the exam has begun, late students will **NOT** be allowed into the testing room, and they will not be allowed to test during the late testing window. **NO** exceptions.

- Students taking **AP Computer Science Principles English Language, English Literature, Seminar, US History, World History, French Language, Japanese Language, Spanish Language, and Music Theory, MUST** bring their **FULLY CHARGED** school issued laptop & power cord to their exam. **None will be provided.** Laptops cannot have test subject related materials anywhere on the laptop.
- **For all Digital Exams:** You **MUST** know your College Board account Login & Password.
- **NO** food allowed in the testing rooms. Students may bring an **unlabeled** clear or metal water bottle identified with their name. Water bottles will be placed in a designated area in the testing room, and students will be able to access their water **ONLY** during the scheduled break. Only students with both an **AM & PM** exam on the same day may bring a bag lunch to eat quickly in-between the exams.
- **NO** backpacks, bags, purses, pencil cases, containers of any kind, and other belongings allowed in testing rooms. Keys are fine.
- Dress in layers - room temperatures vary greatly. No printed clothes related to exam material.
- There will be **NO** use of the restroom during the actual exam – only during scheduled breaks short of an absolute emergency. Plan accordingly.
- Afternoon exams will end after busses leave, so you will need to arrange for transportation home.

### **STUDENTS SHOULD BRING THE FOLLOWING ITEMS IN A CLEAR ZIPLOCK BAG:**

- Several sharpened No. 2 pencils (with erasers) for completing multiple-choice answer sheets.
- Pens with black or dark blue ink for completing areas on the exam booklet covers and for free-response questions in most exams.
- An **analog watch** that does not have internet access, does not beep or make noise, and does not have a timer or an alarm
- Up to two approved calculators with the necessary and approved capabilities if taking an **AP Biology, Calculus AB, Calculus BC, Chemistry, Environmental Science, Macroeconomics, Microeconomics, Physics 1, Physics 2, Physics C: Mechanics, Physics C: Electricity & Magnetism, Precalculus and Statistics** exams. **None will be provided.** Visit [www.collegeboard.org/ap/calculators](http://www.collegeboard.org/ap/calculators) to learn more about the calculator policy for each of these exams and for a list of authorized calculators. Bring extra batteries. **\*\*Calculators CANNOT be shared!**
- A ruler or straightedge **if** taking a Physics Exam. **None will be provided.**

### **STUDENTS CANNOT BRING THE FOLLOWING ITEMS TO EXAMS:**

- Electronic equipment - phones, smartwatches, digital watches, AirPods, any wearable technology of any kind, timers of any type, cameras, recording or listening devices, or any other type of electronic or communication device. You will be expected to take any of these items out of the testing room, and we will not be responsible for it.
- **Students using any of the above devices during an exam OR exam break will be dismissed in accordance with College Board guidelines, and your score may be cancelled.**

- **Digital watches** - You will be expected to take it out of the testing room, and we will not be responsible for it.
- **Mechanical pencils**, No. 3 pencils, or colored pencils
- Books, compasses, protractors, correction fluid, dictionaries, highlighters, or notes.
- Scratch paper - We will provide it for students, as needed.
- Backpacks, bags, purses, pencil cases, and containers of any kind (except for your Ziplock bag containing approved materials) - You will be expected to take any of these items out of the testing room, and we will not be responsible for it.
- Ear plugs

### **TIME:**

Most AP exam administrations will take 3 ½ to 4 hours. You **may not** be dismissed until an exam has officially ended. Do not ask to leave early if you finish before the end of the test, as your request will be denied. If you play a sport, have a job, or participate in any other extracurricular activity, it will be your responsibility to inform your coach, employer, etc. of your AP obligation, and arrangements should be made accordingly. Afternoon exams will end after busses leave, so you will need to arrange for transportation home.

### **ATTENDANCE:**

On a day you have an AP exam, you will be excused from your classes for the entire day. You will be coded as "TST" for all periods on the day of your respective exam(s). Students who choose to attend class before or after an AP exam will check-in with their subschool so that attendance is corrected in SIS.

### **LATE OR SICK:**

The College Board has strict guidelines on who may take a late exam. College Board may allow a late test for a serious illness, and a doctor's note will be required for such a request. Late testing is not allowed for oversleeping, minor illnesses, car/bus trouble, missing the bus, arriving late to an exam, etc., so arrange for transportation and leave home with plenty of time to spare.

### **BEHAVIOR:**

You are expected and required to abide by the policies of both the College Board and Lake Braddock Secondary School during the exam period. Any misconduct will be reported and/or you may be dismissed from the exam, which could jeopardize your AP exam score, and you will not be permitted to take a late exam.
