Alcanza College Fair

George Mason University will be hosting the 24th Annual <u>ALCANZA</u> College Fair on Wednesday October 16th. George Mason hosts <u>ALCANZA</u> as part of our effort to increase college interest and awareness among high school students in the Washington, D.C. metropolitan area during Hispanic Heritage month. This event was created to get Latinx students motivated and excited about their post-secondary plans, and the program is open to all students in the Washington D.C. metro area to explore their educational opportunities beyond high school. Over 150 colleges from all over the nation will attend <u>ALCANZA</u>, and we expect about 2,000 high school students to participate. Free NASA Opportunities for Virginia High School Students!

The Virginia Space Grant Consortium provides FREE NASA-related programs for Virginia's high school students in 10th, 11th, and 12th grades. The programs have an interactive online STEM learning experience and are highlighted by a seven-day residential summer academy at NASA.

10th GRADE

Virginia Space Coast Scholars (VSCS) focuses on the current missions flown or managed by NASA Wallops Flight Facility on Virginia's Eastern Shore. http://vsgc.odu.edu/spacecoast/ - This online course application is **OPEN UNTIL OCTOBER 24**.

11th AND 12th GRADE

Virginia Aerospace Science and Technology Scholars (VASTS) focuses on NASA's human spaceflight missions and the Journey to the Moon and on to Mars. Students learn from NASA experts on how to design space missions! http://vsgc.odu.edu/VASTS/, applications are **OPEN UNTIL OCTOBER 24**.

Virginia Earth System Science Scholars (VESSS) focuses on the challenges the next generation of scientists and engineers to become part of the solution to the societal issues faced by the impacts of climate change. LBSS Nomination Required Scholarships

Below are two scholarships with upcoming deadlines. I will collect self-nomination forms and then a committee will determine which students move forward for ultimate consideration. Please let me know if you have any questions. The title of each scholarship links to the relevant website. The scholarships link in the colleges tab of Naviance lists many other amazing scholarships as well. These are simply the ones that require a nomination from LBSS with deadlines through October.

UVA Jefferson Scholarship

LBSS can nominate ONE senior to compete for this full scholarship to UVA. Jefferson Scholars are selected on the basis of demonstrated excellence in the areas of leadership, scholarship and citizenship. Typical Jefferson Scholars are in the top 5-10% of the class and have demonstrated uncommon academic abilities, exceptional leadership talents and an understanding of the broader community around them. Seniors who would like to be considered for the nomination must submit the LBSS Self-Nomination Form for Scholarships. The Self-Nomination form is due to Ms. Hunter skhunter@fcps.edu by October 18, 3PM. Please note: Seniors applying to another college or university under a binding early decision plan are not eligible to apply. Prior interest in UVA and financial need are not factors in selecting a nominee.

UVA Walentas Scholars Program

LBSS can nominate ONE senior to compete for this full scholarship to UVA. The Walentas Scholars Program develops leaders, citizens, and scholars who are pioneers—the first or among the first in their families to earn a bachelor's degree from a college or university. Nominees must be first generation. LBSS will consider all first-generation students in the senior classes who are outstanding contributors to their schools and families. Successful candidates have demonstrated exceptional leadership talents, an understanding of the broader community around them, and have demonstrated uncommon academic abilities. United States Senate Youth Program

The Virginia Department of Education (VDOE) will select two student delegates to represent Virginia in the United States Senate Youth Program (USSYP) sponsored by the William Randolph Hearst Foundation. Each delegate will receive a \$10,000 scholarship and an all-expense-paid trip to Washington, D.C., for the week of March 1-8, 2025. Juniors and seniors are eligible to apply.

Top candidates will be invited to interview with a panel of judges appointed by the VDOE and take the Public Affairs examination. The exam, prepared by the Hearst Foundation, is designed to test knowledge of the United States government, the United States Constitution, American History, and knowledge of public affairs and current events. Final selection will be based upon the student's application, essay response, the examination results, outstanding academic performance, and demonstrated qualities of leadership and community service.

Selected delegates must hold a leadership position in any one of the following student government, civic, or educational organizations during the entire 2024-2025 academic year:

- Student Body president, vice president, secretary, or treasurer
- Class president, vice president, secretary, or treasurer
- Student Council representative
- A National Honor Society <u>officer</u> (including discipline-based Honor Societies such as the National English and Social Studies Honor Societies that include service components)
- Student representative elected or appointed (appointed by a panel, commission, or board) to a local, district, regional or state-level civic, service and/ or educational organization approved by the state selection administrator, where the student holds a high-level position of representation to a constituency in a year-round capacity providing service to others.

The positions listed below **DO NOT** qualify the student for the program:

- Attendance or officer position at Boys/Girls Nation or State summer conference
- General Member of a National Honor Society (serving as an elected officer is acceptable)
- Member or leader of the Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, or a sports team
- A founder or chairperson of a self-created group
- A participant, captain or officer in Mock Trial, Debate Team, Model UN or other academic club, mock legislature, conference, or competition where the primary engagement is for individual educational benefit.

All applications must be submitted and timestamped by 5:00 p.m. on Monday, September 30, 2024. All applications will be submitted through the <u>Online Student Application Portal</u>. (Students must be logged out of their fcpsschools accounts to gain access.) Each application will consist of contact information, two letters of recommendation, a personal essay, an academic essay, and administrative verification. Lake Braddock Secondary School can support three candidate applications. If more than three students apply, VDOE will notify the school and a selection committee will select the candidates to move forward for consideration. For this reason, students who apply are asked to provide a copy of their application to Ms. Hunter by emailing it to <u>skhunter@fcps.edu</u> or by delivering it to the main office.
