PUBLIC HEALTH YOUTH AMBASSADOR PROGRAM

The Public Health Youth Ambassador Program is in the process of launching its **FREE** Evening and Weekend classes for high school students (10th through 12th graders) at The Fairfax County Government Center, beginning on **October 28th**.

The courses offered there will feature curriculums based around two important subjects that impact young audiences: Teen Mental Health and Drug Addiction Prevention. Learning modules involved in each course session will be provided by two of our key education partners, the Morehouse School of Medicine and the George Mason University School of Public Health.

In terms of timing, our *Evening (Mental Health)* classes run approximately 10-to-12 weeks, on Monday through Thursday from 6:00 PM to 7:00PM.

Alternately, our *Weekend (Drug Addiction)* course takes approximately 6 weeks and will be conducted on Saturdays from 11:00 AM to 1:00 PM.

Each student who graduates will receive a certificate of completion endorsed, individually, by both Morehouse and GMU, along with, a \$500 gift card. In addition, those students who complete the Mental Health curriculum will also receive a **FREE** Chrome laptop. NOTE: the computer option is, unfortunately, not available for our Drug Addiction students at this time.
