Virtual On-site Admissions to University of Mary Washington

Admissions staff from the University of Mary Washington will provide virtual "on-site" application review to applicants from Robinson Secondary School on December 7th.

To be participate in the on-site review, students must:

- 1. Submit the application by Monday, October 30th. If you have already applied and submitted a transcript request, you can still participate.

- 3. Make sure to request your transcript ASAP.

iDISPLA Cybersecurity Challenges ~ Students 13 and over

A contest that recognizes and rewards Fairfax County Public School students for their thinking and new ideas. Students in grades 8-12 are invited to participate in a series of real-world challenges that seek solutions around cybersecurity, broadband access in Virginia, and thermal imaging. These three contests are open to all students age 13 and older. This contest cannot be a required class assignment, but we encourage you to share this opportunity with all of your students. The challenge website is https://fcpschallenge.wordpress.com/. Students will need to register themselves and can enter one, two, or all three of the challenges on the site. When they register, they will need to choose Fairfax County Public Schools as their "role" in order to be entered into the FCPS specific contests. All work is due by October 30. Once the contest closes, submissions will be reviewed by industry professionals and prizes will be awarded! Please contact Stephanie Holt with any questions you may have.

The Science and Engineering Apprenticeship Program (SEAP). We are fortunate to have labs located in our area including, Maryland, Virginia and DC! This is a great opportunity for you to reach out to your students and increase awareness of Navy careers in STEM. This is a paid opportunity for students: \$3500-4000.

The Science and Engineering Apprenticeship Program (SEAP) provides an opportunity for high school students to participate in research at a Department of Navy laboratory during the summer. The goals of SEAP are to encourage participating high school students to pursue science and engineering careers, to further their education via mentoring by laboratory personnel and their participation in research, and to make them aware of Department of Navy research and technology efforts, which can lead to employment within the Department of Navy. SEAP is providing competitive research internships to 250 high school students this year. Participating students spend eight weeks during the summer doing research at 28 Department of the Navy laboratories, including those located in Maryland, Virginia and DC. Flyer is attached.

<u>College Access Fairfax Scholarships</u> - College Access Fairfax offers several scholarships to Fairfax County Public School Students. Application submissions open October 15. UVA Jefferson Scholarship

LBSS can nominate ONE senior to compete for this full scholarship to UVA. Jefferson Scholars are selected on the basis of demonstrated excellence in the areas of leadership, scholarship and citizenship. Typical Jefferson Scholars are in the top 5-10% of the class (usually GPA of 4.0 and higher) and have demonstrated uncommon academic abilities, exceptional leadership talents and an understanding of the broader community around them. Seniors who would like to be considered for the nomination must submit the LBSS Self-Nomination Form for Scholarships (attached) AND an essay of 500 words or less which describes in detail a situation or an event which demonstrates your effectiveness as a leader, and how the situation or event has shaped your conception of leadership. The Self-Nomination form and Leadership Essay are to be emailed to Ms. Hunter (skhunter@fcps.edu) by 3PM Monday, October 26. Please note: Seniors applying to another college or university under a binding early decision plan are not eligible to apply. Prior interest in UVA and financial need are not factors in selecting a nominee. Please note, this scholarship is test blind and your scores, if available, will not be submitted.
