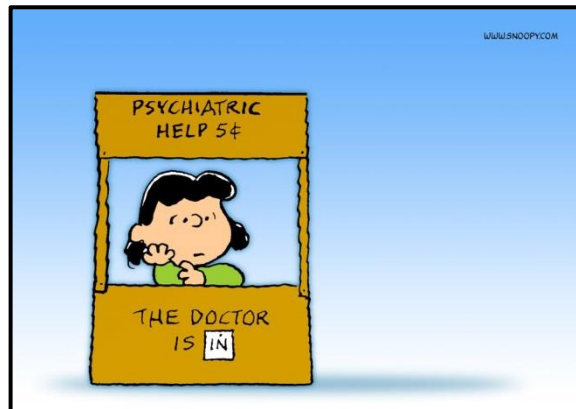
Role of School Counselors

- Academic advising—course selection, goal-setting, advocating for students
- College/Career Advising—Post Secondary Planning
- learning about colleges, careers, academic support, community agencies...



Role of School Counselors

- Personal concerns—issues with friends, family, teachers, individual and/or group counseling, consultation with parents, teachers, and other staff
- Examples: Needing assistance with bullying issues, family needs and/or communicating with your teacher

Advisory and WIN

- **Advisory** and **WIN** time occur during 4th period.
- 4th Period is split into two sessions:
 - The first half of 4th period takes place with an assigned **Advisory** teacher. Advisory teachers work with their cohort of students on lessons connected to Social-Emotional Learning. The Advisory teacher also works to support their students' academic success.
 - The second half of 4th period is called **WIN**—What Individuals Need. Students are given the option to flex to another classroom to receive help from one of their teachers. If students do not need additional support in another class, they remain in their assigned Advisory for the remainder of 4th period

Additional Standard & Advanced Diploma Requirements

- Students *must* take a sequential elective to satisfy their electives requirements
- Sequential elective examples: Studio Art 1 & 2, Journalism 1 & 2, Accounting and Business Management
- World Languages do NOT count as a sequential elective
- CTE credential exam OR completion of an Honors or Advanced Placement course (Standard or Advanced Diploma)
- Completion of CPR/AED training through Health & PE 9

Additional Diploma Options for Students with an IEP

Standard Diploma with credit accommodations

- Determined by the IEP team process
- Provides the opportunity for students to receive a locally awarded verified credit (LAVC) on their SOL required tests, with a score of 375-399, as well as the opportunity for adjustment in course requirements (primarily math)

Applied Studies Diploma

- Determined by the IEP team process
- Utilized for students who have not been able to meet specific requirements of the Standard Diploma or Standard Diploma with credit accommodations

Deleting High School Courses Taken in Middle School

- Students have the option to expunge high school math courses or World Language courses, that they completed during middle school.
- Parents must submit a request in writing to expunge a course to the Director of Student Services in the High School Student Services office **no later than the end of 1st quarter of 9th grade.**

Am I Ready for High School Honors Classes?

- Do I have strong study skills and work habits, and am I willing to do homework for this class daily?
- Have I demonstrated strong skills in this subject in middle school, and am I passionate about the subject?
- Am I comfortable moving at a faster pace through course material, and completing extension projects?
- Do I have time in my schedule with other commitments to be dedicated to an Honors level course?

Changing Courses in High School

- Encourage your student to choose classes very carefully
- Course are normally only changed in high school for the following reasons:
 - You were placed in the wrong course level (you were placed in Algebra 2, but should actually be in Geometry)
 - You auditioned into a higher level in a performance class (Chorus, Band, Orchestra)



When your student is selecting classes, please remind them to consider what other activities that they are involved in that will take up their time. They should find a balance where their coursework is challenging but doable. If they are not sure what level of class they should take, please have them reach out to their teachers and counselors


New Course Selection Timeline

Wednesday, January 13 10:00-11:05	All rising 9th graders will meet with their HS Counselors by Subschool to review the steps to chose HS classes. Students will begin process of entering their classes directly into SIS
Friday, January 22	All rising 9th graders will have completed entering their classes (including alternates) in SIS for the 2021-22 school year
January 25- March 1, 2021	MS Counselors will meet with their current 8th grade students to review all course selections for the 2021-22 school year

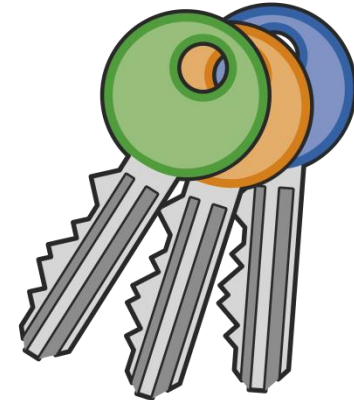
- Create open lines of communication with teachers and counselors
