- Fairfax Connector's Transit Ridership Incentive Program (TRIP) provides 50% off fares
  for low-income residents ages 18-65. Learn more about the <u>TRIP program and how to apply</u>.
- The application period for Fuel Assistance 2025 will end on November 8<sup>th</sup>. The Virginia Energy Assistance Program (EAP) assist low-income households in meeting their immediate home energy needs. The EAP consists of four components: Fuel Assistance, Crisis Assistance, Cooling Assistance and Weatherization Assistance.

To be eligible for Fuel, Crisis or Cooling Assistance, households must have a heating or cooling expense and gross income may not exceed 150 percent of the <u>federal poverty level</u>. Applications for fuel, crisis, and cooling assistance are accepted at the <u>local departments of social services</u> and can be submitted in-person, by mail (USPS), or by fax.

Youth Behavioral Health Services Extend to Local Community Centers
 Mental health support for children and youth is a priority for Fairfax County.
 Community-based behavioral health services for youth and families are now available at three community centers. These centers will provide evidence-based treatment to individuals ages 5 to 18 in need of behavioral health services.
 Mental health support for children and youth is a priority for Fairfax County, and our Fairfax-Falls Church Community Services Board (CSB) is now offering new community-based behavioral health services for youth and families at three community centers.

- **JSSA/ Healthy Minds Fairfax JSSA** Transitions Program provides care coordination, linkages to community resources and supports, and peer-to-peer support for transitionage youth (16 25 years of age) who are:
  - Experiencing intensive needs across multiple life domains
  - Not currently being served by other care coordination or case management programs.

- Formed Families Forward- Stronger Together Youth Peer Support, this is a psychoeducational and peer support group for teens and young adults (age 14 22) that will introduce tools that can be used to navigate everyday challenges. Professional clinicians facilitate the 8 weekly sessions. Skills include interpersonal effectiveness, conflict resolution, self-determination, and self-efficacy. The group emphasizes positive peer supports as a context for strengths-based growth. A light dinner will be served each evening. Regular weekly attendance is expected. groups are led by trained peer leaders with professional and personal experience. A safe space is provided for foster and adoptive parents and kinship caregivers to share resources, express concerns, and share their experiences. The group will meet on Tuesday evenings, Oct 1-November 19, 2024 from 6:30-8:00pm, in Fairfax. Stronger Together Youth Support Group | FFF Formed Families Forward
- Jill's House Weeknight Program- Jill's House is a Christian nonprofit organization that provides families raising kids with intellectual disabilities, ages 6-22, with short-term overnight respite care in the DC metro area and around the country. Kids enjoy fun activities tailored to their interests and abilities for 24–48-hour stays, meanwhile their parents get a chance to rest and recharge. We offer care for the whole family through regularly scheduled typical sibling nights, parent support groups, and family retreats. Rest is vital for families raising kids with intellectual disabilities, due to the high amount of stress they face every day. Respite care is proven to reduce this stress by 60% within the first night and helps create a healthier environment of balance for the family as a whole.
