FAFSA Completion Event

Verified FAFSA IDs Are Required Prior to Event

All FAFSA completion event attendees (students and/or parents) need to have a verified FSA ID. If you arrive without an FSA ID, it is unlikely you will also be able to complete your FAFSA at the event (it can take up to three days for an FSA ID to be verified). You can obtain your FSA ID [here](#).

Important Changes to FAFSA Completion Procedures

Each Contributor Must Complete Their Own Section of the FAFSA

Previously, a parent could complete both the student *and* parent portions of the FAFSA. Now, the student and parent must each complete their own portion of the FAFSA. [Here](#) is the information you should bring to complete the FAFSA.

Contributors Must Agree to Use the Direct Link to the IRS Site

Please note FAFSA now requires all contributors to agree to link their FAFSA to the IRS site (even if you know you will not be able to use the direct link and will enter information manually).

There Will Be Limited Computers at the Completion Event

The student and parent should attend the event together, and the student should bring their FCPS laptop. If a parent does attend without the student, please note we will only have a limited number of computers for participant use. Personal computers cannot connect to the FCPS Wi-Fi at the school, and it is against FCPS regulations to bring a student laptop without the student also being present.

Pet Resource Center

About our Pet Resource Center

Fairfax County Animal Shelter's Pet Resource Center provides community-based resources and support anchored in keeping more pets with the families who love them.

By identifying resource gaps experienced by Fairfax County residents, our Pet Resource Center works to prevent the rehoming of companion animals due to inequitable pet assistance services.

Pet Resource Center Services

Vaccine and Microchip Clinics: These monthly clinics offer Fairfax County residents low-cost core vaccines and microchips.

Pet Pantry: Our pet pantry provides pet food and other supplies for Fairfax County residents facing hardship.

Upcoming 2024 Services

Low-Cost Spay and Neuter Options: Our Pet Resource Center will provide affordable spay and neuter options for low-income Fairfax County residents in 2024. This initiative includes a voucher program where residents can apply for a voucher to have their pet spayed or neutered at a local veterinary clinic.

-The Fairfax County Health Department offers maternal child health home visiting services through: **Nurse-Family Partnership®** and **Maternal Child Health Field Nurse** programs. Services are provided by experienced Public Health Nurses for low-income, high-risk pregnant and postpartum women, infants, and children. The Public Health Nurses provide comprehensive, multifaceted care to clients, targeting a multitude of stressors such as low socioeconomic status, history of trauma or abuse, and mental health conditions in order to promote positive health outcomes.
