• Chronic Disease Self-Management Program (CDSMP), The Health Department is proud to offer a 6-week course for community members who want to take more control of their health. Participants can become certified and eventually teach their own workshops if they'd like. The course is offered in English, Spanish and other languages spoken across the county. What is the Chronic Disease Self-Management Program (CDSMP)?

CDSMP helps individuals with chronic conditions learn how to manage and improve their own health, while reducing health care costs. The program focuses on problems that are common to individuals suffering from any chronic condition, such as pain management, nutrition, exercise, medication use, emotions, and communicating with friends, family and healthcare professionals.

CDSMP workshops meet once a week, over a six-week period, for two and a half ours. Each session is co-led by a pair of trained facilitators with 10 to 16 participants in community-based settings such as senior centers, churches, community health clinics, and public libraries.

CDSMP focuses on building the skills that participants need to manage their chronic conditions by sharing experiences and providing mutual support, creating weekly action plans, interactive learning, behavior modeling, problem-solving, decision making, and social support to promote changes in lifestyle, confidence and effectiveness in self-management of one's own health. CDSME is not a lecture-based program.

CDSMP is a program that is provided FREE of charge, throughout Fairfax County by the Fairfax County Health Department.

CDSMP curriculums were developed by the Self Management Resource Center, formerly Patient Education Research Center of Stanford University, http://selfmanagementresource.com

CDSMP programs are available in English and Spanish.

- Women Giving Back is a non-profit organization that provides clothing and shoes to women and children in crisis. Please check the shopping guideline video here.
 - Clients can shop at the boutique 4 times a year. Women Giving Back operates in 2 seasons -Spring/Summer (April-September) and Fall/Winter (October-March).
 - They track data on the clients who shop and will inform them when a client has reached their shopping limit.
- Fairfax County's Farmers Markets have raised the amount of matching dollars for fruits
 and vegetables up to \$40 per week this season. Families who qualify can get these double
 SNAP funds when they shop with their EBT card at the markets. See the flyer for locations






