Moving from MS to HS

- ❖ LBSS is lucky to be one school 7-12th grade!
- ❖ Department chairs are able to review cases prior to the end of the year
- ❖ Transition meetings not required
- ❖ Courses will be discussed at your child's annual MS meeting
- ❖ SPED structures similar to MS: Case manager, Department chair, AP sped
- ❖ Case managers are assigned in August. The case manager will reach out to introduce themselves prior to the first day of school

IEP Participation

- Students will be invited to their IEP
- Independence is encouraged - emailing, meeting with teachers
- Age of Majority
 - When a student turns 18 they become the legal adult of their IEP and all special education processes
 - Parents are still notified and invited, however, the student must sign the consent

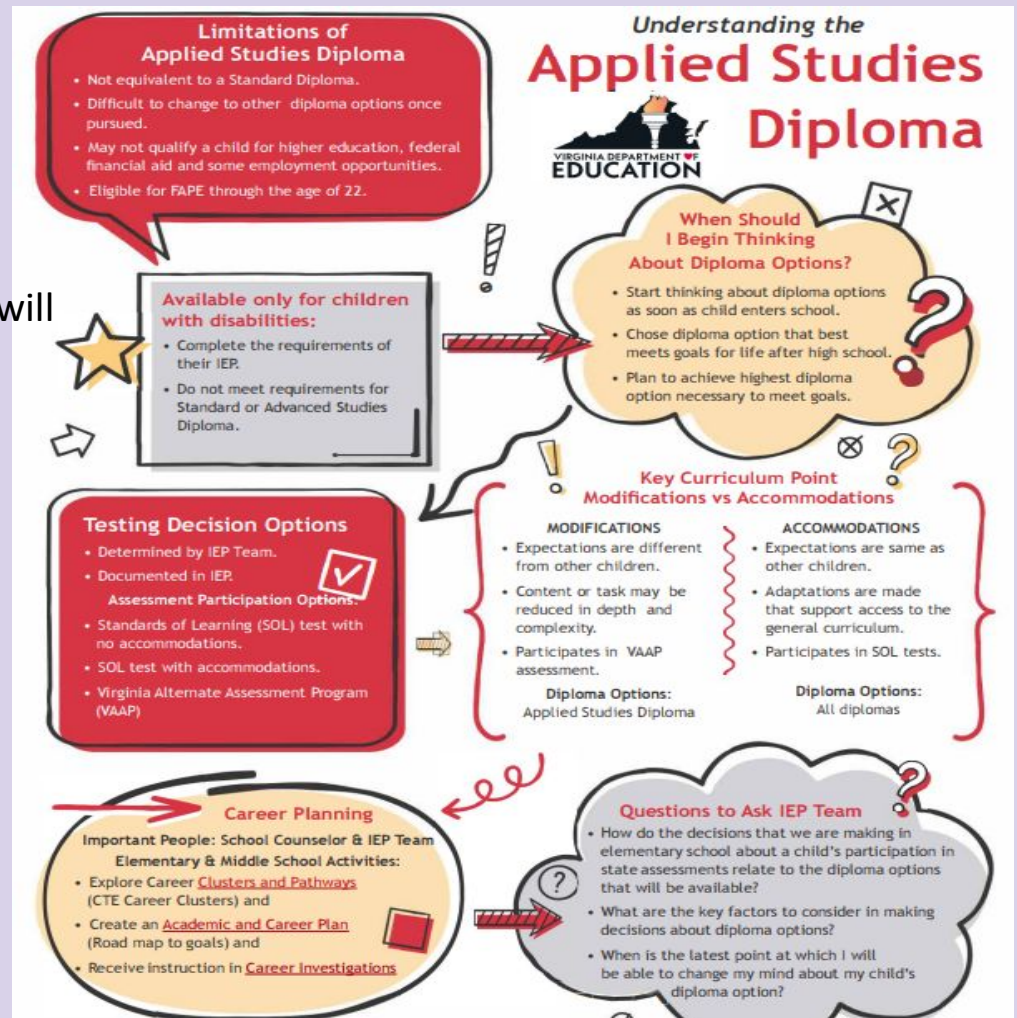

Adapted Curriculum- Diploma Requirements

- Students that take the VAAP assessment will earn an Applied Studies Diploma
- Students do not earn verified credits
- Students complete the requirements of their IEP



Reaching The Graduation Requirements

- Diploma Options (Applied Studies, Standard, Advanced)
- EOC and Verified Credit
- Multiple ways to earn the needed verified credit- you will work with the IEP team to determine the best route for your child
- Course planning can be supported by students counselor and IEP team
 - There is a general progression of course but this can individualized based on student need
 - Typically HS requirements are completed in 4 years, however, this can be extended based on student need

Accommodations - PSAT and SAT

- IEP accommodations do not automatically apply to college board assessments
- You must apply through the college board, the school can apply on your behalf with your request
- Forms on the Lake Braddock website
- This will be discussed at your 9th grade annual IEP

Employment and Transition Services

Employment and Transition Representatives work with students, school staff, and families to prepare for a successful transition from school to postsecondary environments. Services may focus on any of the following:

- Career guidance and exploration, connections to in-school and adult transition services, goal setting and self-advocacy, and post-high school planning
- Facilitating work-based learning opportunities
- Assistance exploring postsecondary education and training options
- Support with finding and getting employment
- Coordination with adult service providers, as appropriate

ETRs typically work with older students in their junior and senior years to help prepare for life after high school
