NEEDS ASSESSMENT OPT OUT

You have the right to consent before your student participates in any federallyfunded survey asking about any of the following: political affiliation or belief of the student or parent; mental or psychological problems of the student or student's family; sexual behavior or attitudes; illegal, anti-social, selfincriminating, or demeaning behavior; critical appraisals of others with whom respondents have close family relationships; legally recognized privileged relationships, such as with lawyers, doctors, or ministers; religious practices, affiliations, or beliefs of the student or student's parent; and income (other than is required by law to determine program eligibility).

You have the right to opt your student out of participation in any survey, regardless of funding source, that requests information about the topics listed above or that requests medical information, information on student health risk behaviors related to alcohol, tobacco or illegal drugs, other information on controlled substance use, or any other information that the School Board deems to be sensitive in nature. This includes the Needs Assessment counselors give to students at the start of the school year. If you would like to opt-out your child from our Needs Assessment, please contact your child's counselor before Wednesday, August 29th.

JUMP START REGISTRATION

Jump Start is designed to assist rising seventh grade students in making the transition to Lake Braddock. Topics covered will include: a tour of the building, practice opening lockers, learning how to read your schedule and organize your materials, and a learning styles and study skills review.

Don't forget all sessions run from 9:00 am - 2:00 pm and transportation is not provided for this program.

COUNSELOR LESSONS: FALL 2018 INTRODUCTION LESSIONS

Starting August 30th, all counselors will be going into English classes to introduce themselves to their students. They will complete activities to get to know the students, explain the role of the counselor in middle school, encourage regular use of the agenda planner as a time management/organizational tool, and introduce the Core Connections tutoring program.

One critical piece of this lesson is a completion of our Needs Assessment. This brief survey is given to all students and lets the counselors know what types of programs we should focus on. It also allows students to note any counseling groups they may be interested in participating in. Parents have the right to opt their student out of the Needs Assessment. If you would like to view the Needs Assessment, please contact your child's counselor.

In addition to the classroom visit, counselors will be holding individual conferences with each 7th grade student in the month of September.

BULLYING AND HARASSMENT PREVENTION

School counselors will be visiting all middle school social studies classes beginning the week of October 1st for bullying and harassment lessons. Seventh grade students are going to learn how to identify different roles individual students take in bullying situations, how to respond to someone who is bullying, and how to report incidents of bullying through their online Blackboard accounts. Eighth grade students are going to learn about the seriousness of sexual harassment, its consequences, and how to report it if it happens. Counselors will also have discussions with students about how the world of social media is impacted by cyberbullying and harassment, and how to react online.

BACK TO SCHOOL EVENTS WHAT TO EXPECT

BRUIN BLAST

Bruin Blast will be the first opportunity you and your student will have to see their schedule for the 2018-2019 school year and receive their locker information. You have received a flyer with Bruin Blast information in your welcome back packet, but here is some additional information to help you navigate this busy morning.

MS Bruin Blast will take place on <u>Thursday</u>, <u>August 23rd</u> between 9 am and 11 am. Please keep in mind that this is an open house and you do not need to be there right at 9 am. There are a few things you will want to do at Bruin Blast, but they do not need to be completed in any particular order.

* Pick Up Your Schedule and Locker Information in the Cafeteria

- * When you arrive in the cafeteria you will see a series of tables set up with the alphabet breakdown posted above the tables.
- * Make sure you have brought the four required forms and have taken care of any obligations you may have! For middle school students these forms include:
 - 1. Emergency Care Card—yes you need to have this with you even if you updated it online!
 - 2. Health Information
 - 3. After School Participation Form
 - 4. SR&R
 - Please note: Families that registered over the summer will not be required to duplicate forms completed at registration.
- * At each table there will be two teachers, one to collect your forms and make sure all paperwork is in order, and another to distribute your student's schedule/locker information. If there are any issues with your paperwork, schedule, or locker, you will be directed toward someone who can assist you.

* Purchase Your PE Uniform in the Gymnasium

- Many rising 7th grade families have already purchased a PE uniform at our Rising 7th Grade Parent Night in June...you can skip this step!
- * If you need to purchase a uniform, they will be available in the Gym.

* Add Money to Your Lunch Account in the Cafeteria

- * Our cafeteria staff will be available to add money to your student's lunch account.
- * Don't forget you can also do this through myschoolbucks.com (formerly mylunchmoney.com).

* Purchase Bruin Gear in the Hallway Outside the Gymnasium

- * Take a Tour of the Building
 - * Starting inside Door 1 and Door 15, SCA and SGA students will be available to give tours to families.
- * Go Find Your Classes
 - * Once you have your schedule this is a great opportunity to go check out where your classes are. You can start planning the best routes to get to your classes and when the best time to go to your locker might be!
- * Set Up Your Locker
 - * Once you have your schedule/locker information you will have plenty of time to practice your locker combination and bring in your school supplies!
 - * Many students struggle with opening their lockers. If you are experiencing difficulty there will be Bruin Ambassadors available to help you, along with other school staff. If you continue to experience issues opening your locker, you can fill out a locker repair form in the cafeteria. The custodial staff will be sure to check each locker before the first day of school.

NEW STUDENT ORIENTATION

On <u>Friday, August 24th</u>, rising 7th grade and newly registered 8th grade students will have the opportunity to attend our New Student Orientation. Transportation will not be provided for this event. Rising 7th grade students should bring the schedule they received at Bruin Blast as they will be visiting each of their seven classes. Counselors will be available to print schedules for students who forget their schedule, or were not able to attend Bruin Blast. This is a student only event! Parents will need to drop off students by door 14 in the morning. Parents will need to park on the blacktop and enter the building at door 12 to pick up your student. Carpooling would be a good option for this event.

BACK TO SCHOOL NIGHT

Middle School Back to School Night will take place on **Thursday, September 6th** at 6:30 pm. Students will be sent home with a flyer for Back to School Night on Friday, August 31st during their 6th period class. Remind them to give you this flyer as it will have a copy of their schedule printed for you along with a map of the building. If your student forgets to give you the flyer you can always pick up a copy of your student's schedule in the Career Center that evening.

NEW PARENT COFFEE

The New Parent Coffee is a great opportunity to meet with the Middle School Student Services team and have them answer any questions you may still have about Lake Braddock. The New Parent Coffee will take place on Friday, September 14th from 8:30-9:30 am in the Lake Braddock Lecture Hall. Make sure you plan for a few extra minutes to find parking.

TIPS FOR COMMUNI-CATING WITH TEACHERS

- * Make sure you have access to your SIS ParentVue and FCPS 24-7 (Blackboard) accounts. In addition to the emailed progress reports, you will be able to check your child's grades anytime through SIS ParentVue. (Access to view student grades will be turned on September 10th.)
- Make sure to read and understand your child's course syllabi. Pay close attention to their grading and second chance assessment policies.
- * Reach out to your child's counselor. They meet weekly with their teams to discuss students. If you have any concerns, this is a great place to start!
- * Email the teacher directly. Teachers may not have a chance to check voicemail during the school day, so email is usually the most efficient way to communicate.

GRADING AND REPORTING

Parents will receive an FCPS generated weekly email with their student's grades in all classes. This email will just contain the student's overall grade in each class. For more detailed information on your student's grade you will need to access your SIS ParentVue account. Access to student grades will be available starting on Sep-



tember 10th through your SIS ParentVue account. This will be a great tool for you to stay informed of your child's progress in all their academic classes. Weekly progress reports will be sent starting September 10th.

With the addition of weekly progress reports, we will be emailing home fewer detailed progress reports. Detailed progress reports will be emailed at interim and at the end of each quarter.

Report cards will continue to be mailed home at the end of each quarter.

GETTING TO KNOW YOUR SUBSCHOOL

At Lake Braddock each student is assigned to a subschool. In middle school subschools are assigned by grade; in high school subschools are assigned by last name. Below you will find some helpful information regarding why you may contact your subschool.

Absences:

* LBSS has an attendance line for each subschool. Parents/Guardians should use the attendance line when calling in their student's absence or tardy.

Late Check-Ins:

* Students should report to their subschool with a note to sign in. They will then be provided with a pass to class.

Early Check-Outs:

- * Students should bring a note to their subschool in the morning. They will then be provided with a pass to leave class.
- * Students must sign out of school through their subschool before leaving the building.
- * Students will leave to meet parents/guardians outside the main entrance to the building.

Locker Issues:

* Locker repair forms will be available in subschool offices during the school year. Students should complete this form if they are having issues with their locker.

SIS PARENTVUE AND STUDENTVUE ACCOUNTS



SIS ParentVue will provide access to view your child's student information, including attendance, report cards, class schedules, gradebook (for middle and high school students), course history, discipline, health, and school information.

A mailing will be sent during the week of August 15th to all newly registered students' parents. A second mailer will go out during the week of September 19th to parents of any new students registered between August 11th and September 14th. These mailers will include detailed instructions on how to create your account. You have each been assigned a unique activation code which you must use to register. The user must provide a valid email address to create the account. After these two mailings, parents will need to request an account at https://www.fcps.edu/resources/technology/student-information-system-sis-fcps/sis-parent-account-overview

Please note: SIS will be live on August 23th, but grades will not be available until September 10th.

<u>SIS StudentVue</u> will allow students access to this information as well. Students will use the same login they use to access school computers. Students can access StudentVue through <u>https://sisstudent.fcps.edu/SVUE/Login_Student_PXP_OVR.aspx</u>

FCPS 24-7 Learning ParentView will provide access to view all of your child's available courses, Family Connection to view academic and career planning (for middle and high school students), and bus stop information. You can also update your child's emergency care information through weCare@school. FCPS 24-7 will be accessed using the same login for your SIS ParentVue account. Parents must have an active SIS ParentVue account to be able to login to FCPS 24-7 Learning.

MIDDLE SCHOOL AFTER-SCHOOL PROGRAM (MSASP) -#BruinsStayAfter

Lake Braddock's MS After-School Program offers a wide variety of clubs including recreation, social, life skills and academic enrichment activities. In addition, staying after to receive academic assistance from your classroom teacher is considered part of the after-school program. In middle school, students choose specific clubs of interest and attend on those meeting dates- it is up to them to stay current with club announce-ments/cancellations.

Students <u>MUST</u> be registered in the After-School Program. It is a required **form** for the 2018-2019 school year.

After-School Program Hours:

Clubs and activities are offered 5 days a week from 2:45 – 4:45PM. Late buses are available on Monday, Tuesday and Thursday at 4:50PM. Parent pick-up is required on Wednesdays and Fridays as well as after 4:50PM on late bus days.

*Please note that a limited amount of clubs meet on Wednesdays and Fridays.
