

# Sequential Electives & Prerequisites

<u>Prerequisite</u> – Any class that you must take before you take a higher level of that class.



# Sequential Electives & Prerequisites

#### **Obvious Examples**

- Photography I → Photography 2
- Digital Art I → Digital Art 2
- Journalism 1 → Journalism 2
- Auto I → Auto 2



#### Other Examples (that aren't so obvious)

- Advanced Band → Advanced Band (or really, any music class that's taken twice)
- STEM Design → STEM Engineering
- Nutrition & Wellness/Intro to Interior Design → Nutrition & Wellness (Gourmet Foods)
- Marketing I → Sports Marketing

- → Make changes to course selections as necessary.






Students analyze the ways authors use language and techniques to shape meaning in literary and nonfiction texts, and they consider how texts provide insight to our complex and changing world. In addition to print texts, students analyze and evaluate how media messages influence beliefs and behaviors across time, place, and culture. Through the study of these varied, authentic texts, students build a sophisticated vocabulary by applying their knowledge of connotations, denotations, word origins, and structures. Students apply their language and communication skills to create texts for authentic audiences and purposes, and they use writing as a tool for personal inquiry and communication. Students also communicate through oral presentations and small-group collaboration specific to authentic situations. Throughout the course, students develop a formal research paper that analyzes complex issues through the synthesis of diverse sources.

## Required Courses

#### Math Options:

- → If you are currently enrolled in <u>Pre-Algebra</u> you will register for <u>Algebra I</u> (313000)
- → If you are currently enrolled in <u>Algebra I</u> or <u>Algebra I Honors</u> you will register for <u>Geometry</u> (314300) or <u>Geometry Honors</u> (314336)
- → If you are currently enrolled in <u>Geometry Honors</u> you will register for <u>Algebra 2</u> (313500) or <u>Algebra 2 Honors</u> (313536)

## **Elective Courses**

- → After selecting your required courses you have 2 periods remaining for electives.
- → In High School almost all electives are year-long courses. There are a few semester electives are paired with another class. For example Nutrition & Wellness and Intro to Interior Design are semester courses, but you must sign up for both classes.
