#### LEAD INNOVATORS

A group of instructional staff will serve as Lead Innovators. These leaders are on the forefront of implementing innovative approaches and will serve as ambassadors of our shared vision. Lead Innovators will open their classrooms and share their work as they reimagine the educational experience.







### CTLEADERS

Collaborative Team (CT) Leaders will guide the work of our vision within our content teams. Their work will focus on teams planning their pacing and unpacking standards, creating common assessments, identifying effective classroom strategies, analyzing student data, and determining and implementing enrichment and interventions.





### Great Beginnings Mentor

Great Beginnings is a comprehensive new teacher induction program with a unified mission of supporting new teachers that has quality mentoring practices, professional teaching standards, classroombased teacher learning, commitment and support. The goal of this program is to help teachers new to the profession, as well as teachers new to the building, form relationships with colleague mentors who can model, guide and advise their mentee.







This past year, Lake Braddock introduced a new opportunity to students called the Principal's Cabinet. The Principal's Cabinet was created by Dr. Smith to get insight from students to glean what LBSS does well and what it could improve. It provided students an opportunity to have a voice in making our school better. The inaugural cabinet of 70 voted and decided to focus on these 7 topics: Teacher Consistency, Student Activities, Respect, Physical Environment, Parking and Security, Mental Health, and Attendance. In October, students picked one of the 7 sub-committees to join. Each sub-committee worked to improve our school in their focus area. There was also one additional sub-committee known as the Steering Committee. The Steering Committee was comprised of 11 students representing both middle school and high school. They met monthly prior to each larger council meeting to structure the work time, as well as to update Dr. Smith on the progress that each committee was making and how the administration could support their work.



#### BRUINS IN ACTION

The BIA Capstone is a year-long, authentic, inquiry-based learning experience that celebrates the end of middle school for Lake Braddock students. It allows 8th grade students to use the skills and knowledge acquired across their classes to become effective global citizens. An essential component of the Capstone challenges and empowers each student to develop an Action Plan for Change focused on a selected issue that impacts the Northern Virginia community. Through end-of-year Presentations of Learning, 8th grade students reflect on their learning and provide evidence about their Portrait of a Graduate skills growth.

As part of their multidisciplinary Capstone, 8th grade students at LBSS will learn about philanthropy through a series of lessons embedded in a Civics class Philanthropy Education Unit: (1) What is Philanthropy; (2) Philanthropy in Northern Virginia and at LBSS -- Live Here/Give Here!; (3) The Roots (History) of American Philanthropy; (4) Why and How To Give Wisely. In past years, as part of the final, Why and How To Give Wisely segment of the Philanthropy Education Unit, students used a curriculum-based decision-making model to select one of five philanthropic focus areas in which to provide a LBSS grant that was used to support Northern Virginia nonprofit organizations serving in that particular focus area. The five focus areas are: (1) Child, Youth Development and Education; (2) Health, Mental Health and Aging; (3) Military Personnel and Their Families; (4) Poverty Relief; and (5) the Environment.
