Course Selection

This year counselors will be meeting with students virtually to select classes. This meeting will take place during WIN Time/Advisory. All Advisory teachers will be given a link to login to the Zoom session that will be run by members of the high school counseling team. Counselors will also be visiting Advisory rooms to answer questions and troubleshoot any issues that may come up. Sessions will be recorded and posted in the Curriculum Fair Site under the Programs page.

Counselor Office Hours

After each Course Selection Session the counselors will be available in the College & Career Center during the next WIN Time. This is a time designed for students who still have questions about how to enter their courses in SIS. Students will be required to register for this session ahead of time using a Google Form. When the form is completed, they will receive an email notification that can be used as their pass.

Academy Showcase

Students will have an opportunity to come meet the FCPS Academy Counselors and Learn about the technical and vocational classes they have to offer for the 2022-2023 School Year. Students will be required to register for this session ahead of time using a Google Form. When the form is completed, they will receive an email notification that can be used as their pass. et a jumpstart on your college education while you're still in high school! For a limited time, NOVA is offering select college courses at no cost to Fairfax County high school juniors and seniors. Courses are twelve weeks in length and will begin February 1, 2022.

Completed applications are due by January 14th, 2022.

Early Online College offers students many benefits, including:

- Lowering the overall cost of college by graduating from high school with college credits in your pocket.
- Gaining access to campus resources and participating in college events and activities.
- Starting at NOVA and finishing at the college or university of your choice seamlessly with our transfer agreements, including the ADVANCE program with George Mason University.

Who is eligible?

High school juniors and seniors currently attending a Fairfax County public school may apply. Applicants must demonstrate proof of English and math college readiness.

How do I apply to the Early Online College Program?

STEP 1: Apply to NOVA. If you are already a NOVA student, locate your EMPLIDand proceed to step 2. STEP 2: Create a New Student Account. If you have already created an account in nvcc.dualenroll.com, log in and proceed to step 3. You will need your NOVA EMPLID number for your account.

STEP 3: Select your Early Online College course in the nvcc.dualenroll.com portal. You must select Early Online College-Spring 2022 for your term.

STEP 4: Upload a copy of your current high school transcript and any qualifying test scores if your GPA is below 3.0

STEP 5: Check your application status in the nvcc.dualenroll.com portal. Be sure your parent or legal guardian has consented to your course selection. Be sure to check your email often as we will send you updates as we process your application.



Mental Health? Let's talk about it!
